Teaching

Self-Assessment

- Teaching Experience: I have taught both undergraduate and graduate courses in my previous positions (5 years in graduate school and 5 years at a previous institution).
 These courses have been in-person, online, and hybrid in nature.
- Rapport: I have an ability to develop rapport with my students. Recent student comments mention "the care" I have for my students and their success.
- Course Creation/Development: I have previous experience creating and revising courses (syllabi, activities, assessments, etc.). I also strive to continually refine and revisit my courses for improvement.
- Organization: I am organized and therefore like to ensure that my courses, course materials, and Learning Suite sites are organized and easy to navigate.
- Incorporating Experience: I am able to incorporate my previous experiences as a classroom teacher into my teaching of university students. Professional Goals

- Revise course syllabi, schedules, readings, and activities for both ECE 433 and ECE 202 based on feedback and reflections from previously teaching each course.

- Continue to send out an email to my students after each class describing what needs to be accomplished for the next session and any other important information.
- Continue to start out each class with a student highlight/spotlight to establish rapport.
- Continue to give a midsemester evaluation for each course that I teach. Use the feedback to inform my future instruction and make revisions.
- Learn to use the available resources at BYU such as the CTL and particularly the use of a SCOT.
- Find and try out at least 2 new interactive and engaging activities in my teaching of each course.
- Provide opportunities to integrate the Gospel more fully into my class by including a scripture/thought. I asked students to share thoughts previously, and they were

- hesitant to do so. I plan on have a scripture or quote for each course to get us started. I will specifically draw on the devotional each week to promote spiritual connections.
- Plan to observe a colleague teaching similar courses.
- Seek feedback from my teaching mentors Dr. Ramona Cutri and Dr. Jennifer Wimmer.

Accomplishments
